4. What is Jesus' basic defense in verses 19-24? How effective was it? Why do you think He wasn't more emphatic in His defense?

Reflection

5. When have you dealt with someone whose mind was so made up that the facts didn't matter? How do you deal with this when it relates to your faith?

6. How can openness and transparency help as we minister to and serve one another? How can they hurt?
